# **SQA Exams**

The SQA have published an article for parents and carers of young people preparing for exams this year entitled "National Qualifications: Helping your child prepare for SQA exams in 2023". This can be accessed by clicking HERE. Important points to note are that the Appeals service will return to a model that is similar to what was in place prior to the Covid pandemic where any appeals will only involve a review of SQA marked work and not the submission of work done prior. For young people who are not able to sit exams on the day or circumstances cause them not to perform as well as they might, the Exceptional Exam Circumstances Consideration Services will be in place. In this case, school will submit evidence.

# **Active Citizenship at Speyside High**

This week, Moray Council passed a motion declaring a *Nature Emergency*, this compliments the *Climate Emergency* that was declared in 2019. This motion was supported by a group of our own S3 students, with their comments being read out in Council Chambers. The students have been discussing these issues in Modern Studies, Geography, and as part of the *Cairngorms2030* consultation. # Cairngorms 2030 at Speyside High

Tuesday 24 January was a busy day for junior classes in school, as we hosted the second *Cairngorms2030 Heritage Horizons* consultation event. Ben Sparham returned to school to speak with students from S1, S2 and S3 about the key issues they had previously identified and how to move these forward with meaningful actions. Issues included local transport, community building, equality, food & farming, and the climate crisis. Groups made use of *Learning for Sustainability* methodologies to explore challenges and desired outcomes as well as identifying issues for making real change.

A huge thank you to all the students who took part and engaged in such a mature and meaningful way. Staff also had a chance to meet with Ben to begin to explore ways that we can incorporate the *Cairngorms2030* initiatives into our curriculums and practice.
