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# **Speyside Sleepout**

On Friday 1 December, as temps dropped to -8 degrees, a group of students and staff from SHS took part in our 6<sup>th</sup> annual Sleepout.

The Sleepouts are all about raising awareness about the issue of homelessness in Scotland. Currently there are over 30,000 families in Scotland who are homeless, and nearly a thousand people are rough sleeping. We aim to raise awareness of the issue and encourage compassion and empathy in our school community, with the hope that we can build solidarity and work towards creating a Scotland where everyone can have a safe place to go home to.

31 pupils and 4 staff took part in the Sleepout this year. It was the coldest one that we have done so far! It is confronting to think that there are people going through this every night. We are currently still counting up how much we have raised through sponsorship and will be donating all proceeds to Moray Women's Aid.

As part of our fundraising for Moray Women's Aid, we also held a lunchtime concert on Thursday 30 November. There were amazing performances from Revision and the school Ceilidh Band plus our headline act "Boys Should Learn" – who were exceptional!

## **Higher Modern Studies Parliament Trip**

The Higher Modern Studies Edinburgh trip took place on the 23 and 24 November. Pupils visited Parliament and were able to watch First Minister's Questions from front row seats. We were then met by Richard Lochhead who spoke about his role as an MSP.
