While there are still a few exams to complete next week this is the last day of study leave and we expect all young people at school on Monday 29 January in classes except when they have an exam.


Senior Phase Study Club

Some information from PISA:-

Belonging at school – Out of a sample of 30 (15 year old pupils) a smaller number of Speyside High School young people feel left out of things, or feel lonely at school than the Scottish average. However, out of a sample of 33 young people at Speyside High School young people were more likely to feel that other students left them out of things on purpose and then made fun of them than the average Scottish statistics.

This is useful in helping us plan school improvement and to support our young people more effectively
